# **New Drive on Internet safety**

Internet safety is a national issue and research has been commissioned at a national level to provide up to date evidence of how young people are using the internet, the dangers they face, and the gaps that exist in keeping them safe.

### A report published by Barnardo's has highlighted the need for:

- Easier access to existing prevention resources and advice, including age-appropriate healthy relationships and sex education through schools
- Training for all professionals working with children and young people so that they feel confident in identifying those at risk of harm online
- Assessments to be carried out by support services to include abuse that relates to on-line harm only

- To look at the current national and strategic position of the key issues influencing internet related activity for children and young people
- To develop an increased understanding of how partners work together in protecting children and young people around safe online internet related activity
- To identify future learning for professionals in Bradford
